Halaal Certification Process

3 Years certification cycles with surveillance visits usually on annual basis as per Pakistan Halaal Food Standard (PS 3733) & DIC Guidelines (DIC/SMIIC-I).

The key stages of the CeSP's Halaal Certification Process (Option A) is described below.



Recertification Audit

Conducted before expiry of certification as per revised Service Agreement.

Stage 1 Audit

This ensures the organization's readiness for the Stage 2 audit. It consists of Document Review and onsite visit to ensure that Halaal management system is established & implemented

Stage 2 Audit

In this phase the client's management system is assessed onsite for its implementation. Audit findings raised as corrective actions

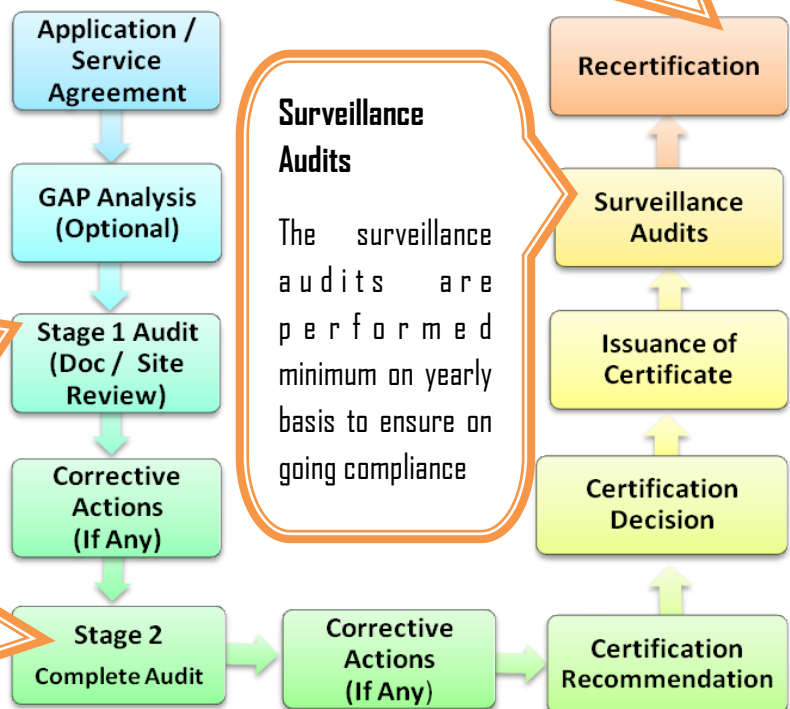


Figure 1: Three Years Halaal Certification Cycle
